Every normal, healthy infant proceeds through a sequence of motor

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development that occurs spontaneously and needs no special training. By four months of age the baby can reach for and grasp an object, and by the 10th month he can grasp a small object between thumb and forefinger.

Nonetheless, basic responses have been measured, and are rather useful in underscoring the early development in infancy of auditory sensitivity. For example, by 35 weeks' gestation fetuses

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can apparently discriminate between 250-Hz and 500-Hz tones (Shahidullah and Hepper, 1994).

This stage is also characterized by an explosion of brain growth in several areas of development (in addition to the emotional development that was

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dominant earlier). Intellectually, children hold ideas in their minds briefly, engage in pretend play, and become increasingly able to focus their attention on topics, people, and objects introduced by others.
