In Renaissance universities, the trivium (literally, the crossing of three part way) formed the essence of the liberal arts curriculum. Examined are topics such as the nature and function of language, distinguishing general grammar from special grammar, the study of logic and its relationship to grammar and rhetoric, and applying the concepts of logic, grammar, and rhetoric to literary works.

Plato and Pythagoras were first in codifying their importance; the flowering of our western understanding of the liberal arts took place in medieval education systems, where they were categorized into the Trivium and the Quadrivium. Grammar, Logic, Rhetoric are the Trivium, and Arithmetic, Geometry, Music, and Astronomy are the Quadrivium.

The Liberal Arts of Logic, Grammar, and Rhetoric THE TRIVIUM

After the 9th century, the remaining three arts of the " humanities " - grammar, logic, and rhetoric - were grouped as the trivium. It was in that two-fold form that the seven liberal arts were studied in the medieval Western university. During the Middle Ages, logic gradually came to take predominance over the other parts of the trivium.

Classical education is comprised of the seven liberal arts which are divided into the Trivium and the Quadrivium. The Trivium subjects are grammar, dialectic, and rhetoric while the Quadrivium includes arithmetic, geometry, music, and astronomy.

The trivium is a collection of the 3 fundamental liberal arts that pupils would study before moving on to the 4 more complicated arts, both of which made up the 7 liberal arts. They were: Grammar; Rhetoric; Logic; These three arts generally aren't studied as their own fields, but they do underpin everything we study in the liberal arts today.

In the medieval European university the seven liberal arts were grammar, rhetoric, and logic (the trivium) and geometry, arithmetic, music, and astronomy (the quadrivium).
