The zebra shark (*Stegostoma fasciatum*) is a species of carpet shark and the sole member of the family Stegostomatidae. It is found throughout the tropical Indo-Pacific, frequenting coral reefs and sandy flats to a depth of 62 m (203 ft).

The zebra shark is a large, distinctive shark that lives in shallow coral reef habitats in tropical waters where they can wriggle into narrow crevices and caves in search of food. Its appearance, which changes as the shark reaches maturity, has caused confusion among divers who often mistake it for the leopard shark.

Zebra sharks are found in the western Pacific Ocean from Japan to Australia, as well as the Indian Ocean and Red Sea. Zebra sharks feed mainly on mollusks and crustaceans as well as small fish. This shark’s flexible body allows it to squirm into narrow crevices and reef channels in search of food.

The zebra shark is a docile, slow-moving shark, considered harmless to humans. It spends most of its day resting on the ocean bottom, becoming more active at night, when it feeds on a variety of bottom-dwelling invertebrates. The species gets its name from the coloration of its young.

Zebra Shark Zebra sharks don't have to swim to breathe. By day they rest on the sandy bottoms of Indo-Pacific reefs with their mouths open and powerful throat muscles pumping water across their gills. Zebras often face into the current, even propping themselves up on their pectoral fins, to get more oxygenated water with less pumping.

Long and sleek, zebra sharks can wriggle into reef crevices and caves to hunt for their favorite food. Barbels (fleshy feelers) on their snouts help them search for their prey. Zebra sharks hunt at night; in the daytime they usually rest quietly on the bottom, "standing" on their pectoral (side) fins.

The zebra shark has a moderately stout, cylindrical body with 5 prominent ridges running along the dorsal surface and flanks (Compagno, 2001). The head has 5 small gill slits with the last 3 located behind the origin of the pectoral fins. The nostrils are close to the front of the rounded snout which has short barbels (Randall and Hoover, 1995).
